This handbook is not intended to be an all-inclusive resource or the last word on the law or rules. Because no handbook can anticipate all factual scenarios that may be faced, nor can any handbook stay abreast of the constantly changing legal interpretations and applications of germane statutes and rules, this handbook should be used only as a guide or training tool and for research

This handbook summarizes the powers and duties of Idaho county officials as well as the services provided by the county governments in Idaho. It is designed to provide county officials with a summary of their functions and a reference to the provisions of Idaho law which relate to those functions. High school and university students; and civic groups, such as the League of Women voters; state legislators; and other elected officials would also find this handbook to be a useful source of information on county governments.

This handbook is only a guideline. County officials using this handbook should look up the provisions of the *Idaho Code* cited in the handbook in order to obtain the precise wording of the law. If there is a question concerning the scope or application of the law, county officials should also consult their county attorney. The county attorney or county official may also confer with the Idaho attorney general's office.

This fifteenth edition of the handbook consists of changes in Idaho law through 2014. Since laws passed by the legislature create new sections and chapters in the *Idaho Code* and re-codify existing sections, it is not always easy to recognize all the changes in the law which affects county functions or procedures. To help guard against omission or error, we had a number of individuals read sections and chapters of this handbook. Even with the assistance of many readers, there may be some changes in the law, which we failed to detect. Consequently, we urge all county officials not to act on matters covered by the handbook without checking with their county attorney.

The handbook is published with the assistance and cooperation of the Idaho Association of Counties and county officials. We wish to particularly thank Tony Poinelli, Deputy Director of the Idaho Association of Counties, for the many hours spent reviewing the entire draft of the handbook. Numerous revisions to update and improve the manuscript were done.
