



# # 1 RESOURCE: COUNTY AND STATE STAFF

- IDJC District Liaisons
  6 DL's serving Idaho's 7 Districts, supporting administrators, District Councils
  Representatives of IDJC, working closely with county government, local and state judiciary
- Juvenile Justice Commission
  Governor appointed Advisory Board
  Serves as governing body and oversite for state and federal grants
  Adult and youth community volunteers represent 7 Districts and the Tribes
- IDJC and County POST Training and Certification
  Trains and certifies all county juvenile probation and juvenile detention officers; 883 trained since 2000; 99% of academy instructors are county affiliated
  Trains law enforcement on trauma, brain development and juvenile procedures
- IDJC Substance Use Disorder Services
  Statewide funding for substance use treatment of youth at the local level
  County probation and IDJC collaboration for the delivery of substance use services

#### **PROGRAM COLLABORATION**

- PASS THROUGH FUNDS FOR LOCAL PROGRAMS
  - Community Incentive Program
  - · Addresses gaps in services, 165 youth served, 97% success rate
  - Mental Health Program
    - Assist with gaps such as wrap around services through the mental health courts, served 165 youth with a 98% success rate
  - Juvenile Accountability Block Grant (final year)
    - Keeping youthful offenders in the community while being accountable for their behavior, examples of the county allocation are partial JPO salaries, treatment, and juvenile trackers
  - IDJC allocation supports re-entry funds to improve re-integration services such as juvenile sex offender aftercare

# PROGRAM COLLABORATION

- COUNTY JUVENILE DETENTION CLINICIAN PROJECT
  - A Clinician in Idaho's 13 Juvenile Detention Centers
  - In it's 9th year of service
  - Every youth entering juvenile detention is evaluated
  - Identifies mental health and/or substance use issues
  - Identifies the need for medication management
  - Connects youth and family to local services upon release

# **PROGRAM COLLABORATION**

- IDJC SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER SERVICES
  - IDJC SUDS administers funding to Idaho's seven districts for treatment for youth on the local level
  - $\bullet\,$  Youth have direct access to services in home communities
  - $\bullet \ \ Assessment, Outpatient, Intensive \ Outpatient, Inpatient\\$
  - 1,046 youth served throughout the state of Idaho
  - New services: enhanced family therapy, tele-health based treatment, and transportation for treatment services

# **PROJECT COLLABORATION**

# • MILLENNIUM PROJECT

- Awarded to IDJC
- Supports local level activities to meet the needs of low risk offenders in least restrictive manner to prevent future offending behavior
- IDJC funded 26 community-based programs, serving 980 youth in it's first year
- IDJC was awarded a second year grant to support current and new local programs
- $\bullet$  IDJC is preparing a  $3^{\text{rd}}$  year grant application



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
