
IAC Corporate Partner Guidelines

Corporate Partners are expected to conduct themselves in a manner that aligns with the mission and values of the Idaho Association of Counties (IAC). Partners agree to:

- Support the mission of IAC to promote county interests, encourage ethical behavior, advocate for sound public policy, support best practices, and provide education and training to assist Idaho county officials and staff in the performance of public service.
- Provide products, services, or expertise that address the professional needs of Idaho counties, county officials, departments, and staff.
- Conduct business in a manner that upholds IAC's integrity, credibility, ethical standards, and public trust.
- Not actively participate in or advocate for or against a specific policy position, political campaign, or political referendum or initiative at IAC events or through IAC communications, publications, or member contact lists.
- Use IAC member contact information responsibly. Member information may not be harvested, sold, shared with third parties, incorporated into external databases, or used to generate independent mailing lists. Communications with members should remain respectful and relevant to county business.
- Corporate Partners may not represent their partnership as an endorsement of their products or services by IAC, nor may they use IAC's logo on any physical or digital materials without prior approval from IAC staff.

Companies or organizations that do not meet these guidelines may be denied participation in the Corporate Partner program. Current Corporate Partners found to be in violation may have their partnership canceled. Annual dues may be refunded on a prorated basis depending on benefits already utilized.
