GEM Plan Report – Minidoka County Commissioner Jared Orton gave updates on: The State had some extra covid funds in which GEM Plan received about \$2.5 million. The board has not met yet to figure out where to apply the funds.

Legislative Report – Minidoka County Commissioner Jared Orton gave updates on: nothing to report.

IAC Representative Report – Blaine County Treasurer John David Davidson gave updates on: possible partnerships with CES and Syringa for procurement. Syringa focusing on technology and programing side. CES being the more traditional procurement. Also discussed their vision for the upcoming year which includes focusing on the IAC representatives for the districts to reach out and see what resources are available to help with problems. For examples: small counties that don't have an HR Department, public administrations. Maybe pull resources to apply for grants collectively as a district rather than counties individually. An Exploratory Committee has been made to see where resources can be pulled. Another objective is trying to establish a panel for the upcoming annual conference to discuss insurance, fire issues, disasters, etc.

Assessors – Gooding County Assessor Justin Baldwin gave updates on: guidance of a lawsuit that involved Lincoln County and the Tax Commission in regards to prorating the homeowners exemption from 2022-current. The District Court was in favor of Lincoln County. The Idaho Supreme Court was in favor of the Tax Commission. Very recent ruling saying Lincoln County is going to have to payback the difference on the prorations. Kind of a moot point because in 2026 every county is going to be prorating the homeowners exemption based on a new law passed during this last legislative session.

Clerks – Minidoka County Clerk Tanya Page gave updates on: Notices of interest being recorded on behalf of a company that says they are buying land which they may or may not be from local land owners. Just be aware that fraud may be coming our way. Hoping to talk about more that during their conference in August.

Blaine County Clerk Stephen McDougall Graham gave updates on: Funding for waterways in general. In Blaine County, its become an unsustainable model due to statutory changes allowing boat registrations to be purchased anywhere therefore letting the associated fees to not go towards the county where the boats are being used. Hoping this gets addressed more.
