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COUNTY ASSESSORS



County Assessor: Roles & Responsibilities

- Assess & Reappraisal of Property
 - Title 63
 - §31-2501
- Map properties
 - §63-209
- Title & license motor vehicles, mobile homes & other vessels
 - §49-205 & §49-401A



County Assessor & Board of County Commissioners

BOCC

- Fixes salaries for County Assessor position (§31-816)
- Required to furnish necessary funds and personnel to carry out county valuation program (§63-314)
 - County revaluation levy (may not exceed 0.04%)
- Board of Equalization (§63-3501 & 63-503(1))



COUNTY CLERK OF THE COURT, AUDITOR, & RECORDER



County Clerk: Roles & Responsibilities

- Clerk of the District Court <u>Title 1, Chapter 10</u>
- Ex Officio County Auditor Title 31, Chapter 23
- County Recorder <u>Title 31, Chapter 24</u>



Elections

- Chief Elections Officer <u>Title 34</u>
- Clerk to the Board of County Commissioners <u>Title 31, Chapter 7</u>



County Clerk & Board of County Commissioners

- BOCC fixes salary of county clerk position each year
- Clerk empowered to appoint deputies and assistants needed to carry out duties of office
- Compensation of clerk's staff determined by county budget approved by county commissioners
- As clerk of BOCC, county clerk may assign this duty to a staff member
- List of duties of clerk to the BOCC §31-708



County Clerk & Board of County Commissioners

- County auditor serves as county budget officer <u>Title 31, Chapter 16</u>
- County auditor responsibilities
 - Compile and prepare preliminary budget
 - Ensure compliance with the approved budget
 - Submit quarterly statements to BOCC showing expenditures and liabilities against each separate budget as well as unexpended and unencumbered balances of each budget
 - Info allows BOCC to take action as needed to prevent deficits or excessive expenditures from appropriations provided in county budget



COUNTY CORONER



County Coroner: Roles & Responsibilities

General powers and duties (<u>Chapter 28, Title 31</u>):

- Determining cause of death,
- Disposition of the deceased,
- Marshaling assets,
- Acting sheriff authority,
- Vacancies, and
- Continuing education requirements.



County Coroner: Roles & Responsibilities

General powers and duties (Chapter 43, Title 19):

- Investigate deaths,
- Death reporting,
- Autopsies,
- Release of the body, and reporting requirements.



County Coroner & Board of County Commissioners

BOCC shall set the salaries of the coroners and their deputy coroners. 31-3106 and 31-2809

The BOCC shall also provide for burial or cremation of deceased indigent persons. 31-3412



COUNTY PROSECUTING ATTORNEY



County Prosecuting Attorney: Roles & Responsibilities

- Article V, Section 18 of the Idaho Constitution, sets out the terms of office and qualifications.
 - Required to be a practicing attorney, a resident, and an elector of the county for which the individual is elected.
 - Deputy PAs must possess the same qualifications required of the Chief PA except for the county residency requirements.
- The primary responsibility of the PA is to serve as a chief LE officer of the county. As such, the PA is to enforce all penal provisions of any and all statutes of the state in any court. 31-2227



County Prosecuting Attorney: Roles & Responsibilities

- PAs are required to prosecute all felonies for criminal actions listed in <u>Title 18</u> regardless of the issuing agency and to prosecute misdemeanors issued by county or state police officers.
- PAs are also allowed to contract with cities to try their misdemeanor cases. 31-2604
- PAs serve as the legal advisor for county officers on civil matters.
 31-2604



County Prosecuting Attorney & Board of County Commissioners

- BOCC shall set the salaries of the PAs and their deputy PAs.
 31-3106
- BOCC may appoint and/or contract with an attorney in the event there is a vacancy and there are three or fewer resident attorneys in the county willing and qualified to function as the PA.
 - This attorney shall perform the duties for the remainder of the term or a shorter period as determined by the BOCC.
 59-907



County Prosecuting Attorney & Board of County Commissioners

- The PA has the following responsibilities with regards to the BOCC:
 - Provides legal advice to BOCC and other public officers of the county <u>31-2604</u>
 - Advises BOCC on legal manners <u>31-2607</u>
 - Attends BOCC meetings when required <u>31-2607</u>
 - Represents the BOCC in claims and accounts against the county. 31-2607



COUNTY SHERIFF



County Sheriff: Roles & Responsibilities

- As the chief law enforcement officer of the county, the county sheriff has the primary duty of enforcing all provisions and statutes of the state (<u>Title 31</u>, <u>Chapter 22</u>).
 - Jail-keeping
 - Officer of the court and civil process
 - Extradition proceedings
 - Peace officer
 - Emergency dispatch services
 - Driver's license and identification card issuance



County Sheriff & Board of County Commissioners

- BOCC shall set the salaries of the sheriff and their deputy sheriffs. 31-816 and 31-3106
- The BOCC is required to fund county-provided components of the justice system "at levels which advance the interests of the public..." 31-4601
- The BOCC is also required to inspect the county jail quarterly.
 This is not a duty that can be delegated. It is a BOCC direct responsibility. 20-622



COUNTY TREASURER



County Treasurer: Roles & Responsibilities

- County Finance Officer <u>Title 31, Chapter 21</u>
 - Accounts receivable and accounts payable
- County Investment Officer <u>Title 57, Chapter 1</u>, <u>§67-1210</u> & <u>§67-1210A</u>



County Treasurer: Roles & Responsibilities

- Tax Collector <u>§31-2102</u>
 - <u>Title 63</u> through multiple chapters lays out duties relating to tax revenue collection
- Ex Officio Public Administrator §31-2102
 - <u>Title 14, Chapter 1</u> Explains authority and responsibilities of public administrator



County Treasurer & Board of County Commissioners

- Salary for treasurer's office set by BOCC
- Treasurer required to make detailed quarterly report at regular
 BOCC meetings §31-2113
- County treasurers, when empowered by BOCC, may appoint deputies and clerical assistants as needed to carry out business office requires <u>Article XVIII Section 6</u>



Budget Responsibilities of County Elected & Appointed Officials

- County auditor responsible for asking counties to provide itemized estimate of revenues and proposed expenditures on forms auditor provides.
- Each county official is required to provide county auditor with the following:
 - Detailed revenues and expenditures from previous two years
 - Amounts received and expended in current year; and
 - Estimates for the ensuing year.
