





TITLE 39 HEALTH AND SAFETY CHAPTER 34

REVISED UNIFORM ANATOMICAL GIFT ACT:


39-3423. COOPERATION BETWEEN CORONER AND PROCUREMENT ORGANIZATION. (1) A coroner shall cooperate with procurement organizations to maximize the opportunity to recover anatomical gifts for the purpose of transplantation, therapy, research or education.



- Honors patients documented wishes through registry


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
NAME Position Paper

ME/Cs should permit the recovery of organs and/or tissues from decedents falling under their jurisdiction in virtually all cases, to include cases of suspected child abuse, other homicides, and sudden unexpected deaths in infants.

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


 ME/C offices should refer all cases to be evaluated as potential donors, as any case not going through the hospital are not otherwise referred. ME/Cs should have a goal of 100% referral of out of hospital deaths investigated by ME/C offices where the last known alive time is within 24 hours.



We ASK . . . that you allow us to draw and provide blood and vitreous on donor cases.

• A nonsterile stick will prevent donation

... we will never recover any organs or tissues without getting prior release and authorization from the coroner.

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
We PROMISE . . .


Scene Deaths and Coroner Referrals

... we will not speak to any family until we have confirmed that they have been notified of the death by the coroner.

We PROMISE . . .

... If an organ is recovered for transplant, but is ultimately rejected, we will contact you to see if you would like the organ returned to your custody. If so, we will facilitate that return.

















Case Study – Zachary Tendoy

- Previously Healthy 18 Month-Old Male
- Admitted Thursday, March 23rd, 2017 and Referred to DonorConnect 7 Hours Later
- Reportedly Fell Out of Crib, Injuries Suspected to be Non-Accidental Trauma
- CT Scan Reveals Bi-Lateral Skull Fractures and SDH. Also Has Bi-Lateral Retinal Hemorrhages
- Abdominal Trauma/Bleeding Exploratory Lap Revealed a Mesenteric Vein Bleed
- GCS of 3: Pupils, Cough/Gag, Response to Painful Stimulus, and OBV All Negative
- Hospital initiates Brain Death testing
- · Boyfriend of Mother Arrested





Tendoy Outcomes:

- Heart Transplanted 7 Month-Old Who Had Spent Entire Life Awaiting Transplant in a Children's Hospital
- · R Kidney Transplanted
- · L Kidney Transplanted
- Liver Recovered Initial Recipient Became Too III to Transplant
 - *Liver Returned to County Coroner, and Accompanied Zachary's Body to Boise for Autopsy
- Strengthened the Prosecution's Case
 *Internal Trauma Noted and Documented by Recovering Surgeon



Case Study – Roger Vulgamore

- DonorConnect notified by SLMV ED on 8/16/16 of a 24 y.o. SIGSW
 - Fleeing Police

SWAT Team Medic (ED Physician) intubates patient to preserve the option of Organ Donation

- Transported to the hospital, and admitted to the ICU
- · Hands bagged, Officer stationed outside room
- DonorConnect onsite later that night, patient is declared Brain Dead
- Patient is located on the Idaho Donor Registry
- Deputy Coroner Will Carson authorizes Donation
- Patient managed in ICU until 8/19/16 Organs recovered



VULGAMORE OUTCOMES:



4 Transplant Teams from 3 states arrive to recover organs:

Right Kidney & Left Kidney/Pancreas to Salt Lake

Liver transplanted in California

Heart transplanted in Salt Lake

Double Lungs transplanted in Washington State

This all happened because somebody preserved the option of donation, called DonorConnect, and the Coroner authorized

Case Study - Skylar Huffield

- DonorConnect Notified at 0600 on 5/25/16 22 y.o. male, homicide victim
- · Patient is located on the Idaho Donor Registry
- DonorConnect on-site at 1400 Patient declared Brain Dead at 1422
- DonorConnect contacts County Coroner Okay to proceed with vital organs, no authorization for tissue
- Homicide Investigators meet with OPO Request to be present in OR to photograph condition of organs
- Patient managed at Portneuf until OR set for 0230 on 5/28/16

Huffield Outcomes:

Pre-trial conference starts for 1st degree murder case



(POCATELLO, Idaho) KIFI/KIDK - On Friday morning, The defense and state gathered for Timothy Blaney's pre-trial.

In 2016, the Pocatello Police Department charged Blaney, 20, with first degree murder for the death of Skylar T. Huffield.

According to Pocatello Police, officers responded to a disturbance at 3842 Hawthome Road. When the officers arrived they found a severely injured Huffield who was taken by ambulance to Portneuf Regional Medical Center. Huffield later died from those injuries.
